Note- Senior Softball: Any Senior Softball Team or Teams, can move on to the (OPEN) State Tournament Providing they do not participate in International Tournament Prior to State Tournament

The Schedules above are using two (2) days between District/Section and (3/4) days between Section/ State/Regional.

Note: If more time is needed for District Play you can start on June 16, 2023 per Eastern Region.

The attached schedule works backwards from Regional tournaments with 4 days (BB), and 3 Days (SB) in between State/ Regional, 7 Days allowed for State Tournament, three days between State/Sectional 7 days for Sectional Tournaments and 2 days between Sectional/Districts.

We need the most time in Districts as this could have the most teams therefore should get most time. Sectionals only have 4 teams so 5 days is more than enough time. States Tournaments Max out at 8 teams and has 7 days, the same as Regional. By running them up against one another it keeps the kids playing and on top of their game.
